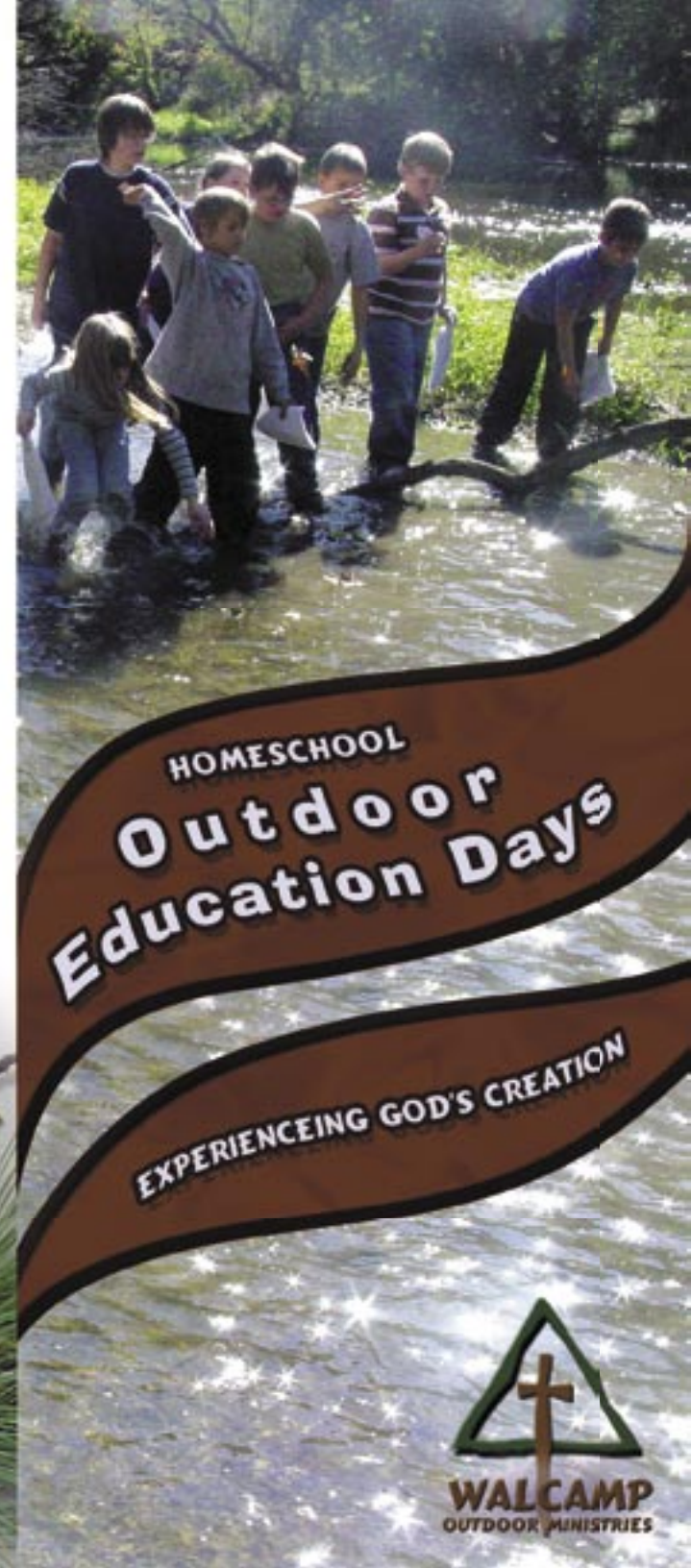

### March 5, 2007 - Pioneer Life

The focus today will be on experiencing history. Students will learn how to use pioneer tools and help make a project for camp. They will sit in wagons and decide what items to take on their journey west. We will discover the history of Kingston and Illinois Native American culture. Ever wonder what it would take to survive outdoors in the wild? Today we will explore the skills needed to survive. We will be talking about things needed to take with you and how to safely build fires and how to cook over that fire. We will also learn about fishing, one of the most important survival skills in food acquisition. There is an additional \$2.50 fee for this day. For lunch, the students will prepare and cook the food provided by Walcamp. They do not need a sack lunch for this day. Please advise us of any dietary restriction when you register.



### May 31, 2007 - Animal Life

Students will be able to explore the 177 acres of Walcamp looking for animals. We will use binoculars and look for birds - everything from the Red Bellied Woodpecker to the Red Tailed Hawk. After looking at animal skins and bones, we will search out animal tracks, homes, scat and markings. Students will also learn about domesticated animals living at the Walcamp Educational Farm. They will learn about the care, feeding and products of the animals. Students will also help care for the organic garden at the Farm.
